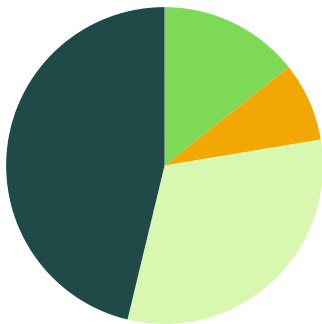

In 2021, at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) established the Mobile Vaccine and Testing (MVT) Team to bring COVID-19 vaccines directly to communities throughout Los Angeles County. Soon after, the team expanded its services to include other vaccinations, such as influenza vaccines, vaccines for seniors, and vaccines for children.

MVT established internal teams to strategically reach the county’s most vulnerable populations, including seniors, homebound patients, and people experiencing homelessness (PEH). The team also partnered with multiple organizations throughout the county to increase operational efficiency and improve patient access to services.

These partnerships included community-based organizations that hosted mobile vaccination events for the clients they served, as well as community-based pharmacies contracted to provide mobile vaccination services throughout the county. To further expand its reach, MVT utilized several engagement strategies, including gift card incentives, community education, and the distribution of harm reduction resources.

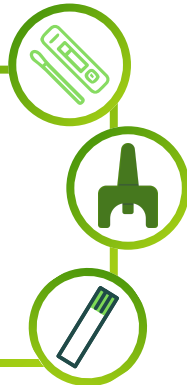

Homebound: April 2021 – February 2025

The Homebound Team focused on bringing clinical services directly to families and individuals who were homebound and might not otherwise have easy access to vaccinations. Vaccinations offered included COVID-19, influenza, and other immunizations recommended for older adults, such as pneumococcal and RSV vaccines.

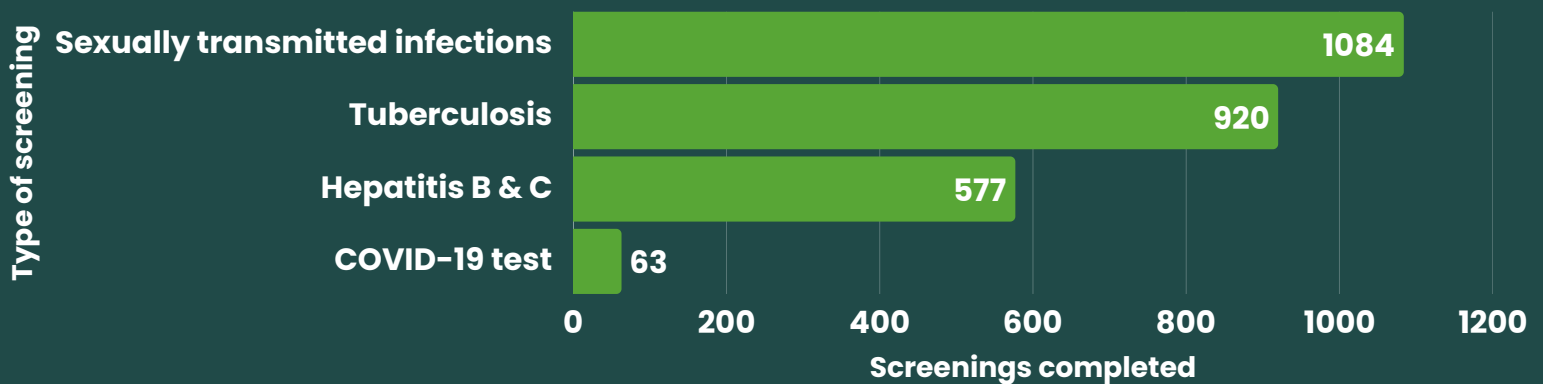

Harm Reduction

As part of MVT's service and engagement model to reach people where they are, MVT distributed 15,519 harm reduction items, including naloxone, COVID-19 test kits, and fentanyl and xylazine test strips.

Screening Services by Type

In 2023, MVT expanded its efforts to reach more people experiencing homelessness by adding screening services for sexually transmitted infections (STIs), tuberculosis (TB), and hepatitis B and C. See MVT's screening services report for more details.
