

### **Why Routine Vaccinations Matter**

**Vaccination FAQs for Parents** 




#### 1. Why it is important for my child to get routine vaccinations?

- Vaccinations and well-child visits are important for all children and are essential for those under the age of two.
- Vaccinations help keep your child safe, healthy, and in school.
- Vaccinations protect children from serious diseases like measles, mumps, polio, and pertussis (whooping cough).
- If your child has missed some vaccinations, now is a good time to catch up.

#### 2. Where can I take my child to get their routine vaccinations?

- Your child can get their vaccinations at a doctor's office or a local pharmacy. Note that many pharmacies cannot vaccinate children under 3.
- Do not worry if you do not have health insurance or a regular doctor for your child. To find a free or low-cost immunization clinic near you, visit <a href="mailto:ph.lacounty.gov/ip/clinics.htm">ph.lacounty.gov/ip/clinics.htm</a> or call 2-1-1.



# 3. Can my child get vaccinated against COVID-19 and other diseases at the same time?

- Yes. The COVID-19 vaccine can safely be given at the same time as other routine vaccines.
- Your child does not need to wait between getting a COVID-19 vaccine and other vaccines, including the flu vaccine.



### 4. Why should my child get a COVID-19 vaccine?

- Getting your child vaccinated lowers the risk of serious disease, hospitalization, or long-term complications that can affect their life.
- It is important for your child to be up to date with the COVID-19 vaccine. Vaccines, including the COVID-19 vaccine, are periodically updated to better protect against new circulating strains of a virus.

## 5. Will I need my child's vaccination records when they register for school or childcare?

 Yes. All students need to show that they have received all school required vaccinations. This includes all students entering childcare, kindergarten,
