The State's DMC-ODS waiver plan is potentially the most extensive transformation of the substance use disorder (SUD) system in California and Los Angeles County since the establishment of the Federal Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant in the 1980's. It proposes to expand SUD treatment services reimbursable under the Drug Medi-Cal program using determination of medical necessity, the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) placement criteria, and quality assurance and utilization management processes to improve outcomes for Medi-Cal beneficiaries while also reducing overall health care costs. Los Angeles County intends to apply to participate in the DMC-ODS plan. As a key component of the application process, SAPC needs to receive input on its proposed implementation plan from its stakeholders. Therefore, your experience as a service provider, client, community member and/or other stakeholder is essential for SAPC to prepare a viable application to the State.

We look forward to your participation and welcome your feedback on how to improve SUD services in Los Angeles County. We also encourage you to distribute this announcement to others who can inform this process, including current or former clients of SUD services.
