RYSE – Pillar I: Reimagining Environments for SUD Engagement & Treatment (RESET)

What are RESET funds?

• One-time funds to create spaces in treatment facilities that are meant to increase youth engagement and retention.

Who is eligible?

Current contracted SAPC youth treatment providers.

What can RESET funds be used for?

 Examples include programming supplies such as art or sports equipment, minor renovations to develop youth centered spaces, furniture etc.

Recovery Housing

Overview

- Information Notice 25-04
- Eligible to stay up to 12 months
- Concurrent enrollment in treatment not required
- Currently there are **137** beds available

Eligibility

- In need of a stable, safe, and abstinence-based living environment
- Having engaged in SUD treatment and/or RBH for a minimum of 30 days in the last 90 days.
- Able to conduct activities of daily living independently.

Referral Process

- SAPC Managed referrals
- See IN 25-04 for referral process
- SAPC has started taking referrals
