Discharging Residential Clients to Safe and Stable Housing

FY 22-23 CalOMS Data:

- 10,000+ admissions of homeless patients. Of those 7,000 were unsheltered/living outdoors
- 2,600+ discharges to homeless settings
 - 1,600+ to unsheltered / street
- July Provider All-Staff
- Discharge planning begins at admission
- Re-authorizations for residential patients with housing coordination needs

Next Steps
