	While the deadline to submit a contract amendment request for this fiscal year has passed, DMC-related	
	changes can still be submitted for the upcoming fiscal year, and providers are encouraged to share	
	updates, such as new sites or levels of care as soon as possible. Most contracts are set to expire on June 30, and the Contracts Team will send communications that include both allocation updates and	
	instructions for processing extensions. Additionally, billing for the fiscal year is due by July, and a memo	
	with deadlines and guidance will be released in the coming weeks to help avoid missed claims. Finally, the	
	Department has received some provider feedback on its methodology for assessing tiers, which is	
	currently under review with the executive team, with updated guidance expected by the end of April.

Feedback	treatment spaces to be more youth-friendly—such as creating safe, comfortable environments with	
	activities youth enjoy. Additionally, the initiative includes infrastructure investments, incentive-based	
	programming (e.g., career development, recreation), and expanded field-based services for providers to	

	reduce barriers to care (e.g. transportation). The program also accounts for consent laws and aims to overcome engagement barriers, including parental fears and non-billable engagement work among providers.	
Homekey+ Program	 Anna Haughey, DPH Anna Haughey (DPH) presented on the Homekey+ Program, which launched in November 2024 by the California Department of Housing and Community Development. This initiative exclusively funds permanent supportive housing for homeless or chronically homeless veterans and individuals with behavioral health challenges. LA County is slated to receive up to \$321.4 million to serve non-veteran populations with mental health or SUDs. The program adheres to housing first principles—low-barrier, recovery-oriented housing that does not require sobriety or treatment compliance for entry or tenancy. The Los Angeles County Development Authority (LACDA) is the lead applicant, coordinating with departments such as the CEO's Homeless Initiative, DMH, DHS, and SAPC. A request for proposals closed in April, with selected providers to be notified shortly. SAPC is contributing \$5 million to support rental subsidies, expecting to generate approximately 120 permanent housing units with intensive case management services. 	
Clinical Standards & Training Branch Updates	 David Hindman, DPH David Hindman (DPH) shared updates on the SAPC LNC platform, a learning and network management system launching soon. The pilot phase is complete, and feedback from participating providers is being reviewed and implemented ahead of the full rollout. The platform will offer free 24/7 access to trainings, including ASAM, SAGE onboarding, and upcoming equity and MAT introduction courses. Hindman also announced the upcoming needs survey, which will gather input on training topics to guide planning for the upcoming year.
